## Summary of PPG spending 2014/15

### Objectives in spending PPG:

- To increase the proportion of pupils achieving age-related expectations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics
- To increase the proportion of pupils exceeding age-related expectations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics
- To further increase the proportion of children making better than expected progress in Reading
- To increase the proportion of children making better than expected progress in Reading, Writing and Mathematics
- To raise the self-esteem and confidence of target pupils and support them with dealing with their emotions and forming positive relationships with their peers
- To ensure that all pupils have access to school visits to enrich their curriculum and remove the potential cost barrier.

### Summary of spending and actions taken:

- £2340 to employ a teaching assistant for 1:1 and small group support
- £400 Educational Visits
- £1296 music provision
- £205 curriculum enrichment - African Drumming Workshop
- £179 curriculum enrichment - Natural History Workshop
- £780 A contribution towards after school club provision.

### Outcomes to date:

In reading, writing and maths the majority of children (75% in reading, writing and maths) have reached age related expectations. In maths 100% of pupils have exceeded expected progress, with 50% in reading and writing. One child attained below age related expectations, this pupil is on the SEND register and made better than expected progress. However, this child has been identified as having a learning difficulty and is continuing to be supported by outside agencies.

All pupils have attended educational visits to date.

The self-esteem and confidence of target children has improved (evidence from lesson observations, pupil discussions, review meetings).

There has been an improvement in the forming of relationships with peers, however this remains an area for further development.

Music lessons and the African drummer visit have further enhanced self-esteem and the validity

of skills other than academic.
