Summary of PPG spending 2013/14

Objectives in spending PPG:

To increase the proportion of pupils achieving age-related expectations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics

To increase the proportion of pupils exceeding age-related expectations in Reading, Writing and Mathematics

To further increase the proportion of children making better than expected progress in Reading

To increase the proportion of children making better than expected progress in Reading, Writing and Mathematics

To raise the self-esteem and confidence of target pupils and support them with dealing with their emotions and forming positive relationships with their peers

To ensure that all pupils have access to school visits to enrich their curriculum and remove the potential cost barrier.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

£2340 to employ a teaching assistant for 1:1 and small group support

£320 resources,

£160 Educational Visits

£780 A contribution towards after school club provision.

Outcomes to date:

In reading and maths the majority of children (75% in reading, 100% in maths) have reached age related expectations. In writing 50% of pupils have exceeded age-related expectations. One child attained below age related expectations achieved on sub level below, the other pupil is on the SEND register and made better than expected progress. However, this child has been identified as having a learning difficulty which is supported by outside agencies.

The majority of pupils achieved expected progress in reading and writing (100% in reading, 75% in writing). Half of the pupils achieved expected progress in maths but 100% achieved year end expectations.

All pupils have attended educational visits to date.

The self- esteem and confidence of target children has improved (evidence from lesson observations, pupil discussions, review meetings).

There has been an improvement in the forming of relationships with peers, however this remains

an area for further development.
